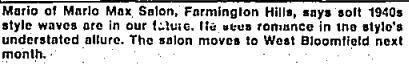

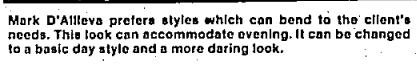

Maida thanked the adults for their support of Catholic education, but made his real intended audience clear.
