

Jewish News hit with slurs

Anti-Semitic graffiti written across the front door of the Jewish News office in Southfield Sunday was described by associate publisher Arthur Horwitz as "unfortunate but probably an isolated incident."

"KKK" and "Jews Get Out" were written in black ink or paint sometime between 3 p.m. and 6 p.m. when it was discovered by an employee of the weekly Jewish newspaper, according to Southfield police.

Horwitz notified police of the incident Sunday night and filed a formal complaint Monday morning. "It was just something I felt should be reported to police," Horwitz said Tuesday.

The Jewish News office is located in the Regency Office Center on Franklin Road near 11 Mile. The paper circulates throughout the Detroit metropolitan area.

Horwitz said this is the first incident of its kind in the six years he's been with the publication.

According to the report given to Southfield police, the newspaper has "on occasion" received threats through the mail or by telephone, but nothing that would be related to last weekend's vandalism.

HORWITZ SAID OF THE GRAFFITI: "It's not something you care to see to start your day." The offending

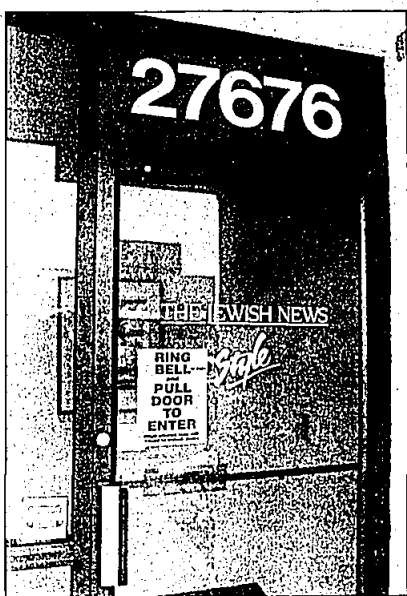

message was washed away after police examined it.

Richard Lobenthal, executive director of the Anti Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, said that organization has no plans to do its own investigation of the incident.

"We do our own investigation only when there is evidence that the police agency isn't doing its job," Lobenthal said. "In this case it's been reported to the police and we have every reason to believe Southfield police are treating the incident seriously and appropriately."

Celebration marks symbolic first date

Of course, some things have changed since Dennis and Mary Koss had that first date.

Twenty-five years ago, the Big Boy restaurant had a drive-in with car hops who served you in your car. It was actually the Koss' four adult children who decided their parents' silver anniversary would be held at the Big Boy restaurant.

"My parents were planning to have a small private party at a more conventional location," said daughter Karl Koss. "But when we told them we wanted to host a party for them at the very same Big Boy where they had their first date, they wholeheartedly agreed."

The anniversary party will be a private function for about 30 family

members, though the restaurant will be open for its normal business.

The Koss children will decorate a small section of the restaurant, including a replica of their parents' original wedding cake and an enlarged reproduction of the Koss' wedding picture.

As for the food, the Kosses prefer to order right from the Big Boy menu, but the restaurant's owner managed to find a 25-year-old menu, so they'll be ordering from the same menu they used on their first date.

Of course, 25 years ago there weren't nearly as many items to choose from on the menu as there are today.

"This is the first time we've ever had a customer use our restaurant for an anniversary party, but we think it's a great idea," said Shaheen Bousmaroun, who, along with Lewis Ansara, owns the Redford Big Boy restaurant.
