NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE C-9-92, an Ordinance to amend the Code of Ordinances, City of Farmington Hills, Michigan, by amending Article II, Building Code, Sections 7-26 thru 7-28, of Chapter 7, Buildings and Building Regulations, in order to adopt by reference the 1990 Edition of the BOCA National Building Code.
