Oakland County will not build four lanes any longer. Five lanes carry twice the load and allow for smooth turning lanes, while costing little more to build.)

I look forward to and will strive to attain our goals, which are all possible.

Ours is one of the finest communities in the state of Michigan. We are new, clean, fresh and we are moving. Our schools, business, industry and our people are the greatest.



But we are experiencing an explosive growth. Now remember, an explosion can get you to the moon and can get you back, but it must be controlled.
