Democrats and MET is superior to Engler's suggestion of replacing MET with a savings bond program. "What benefit is that to consumers?" Kosteva asked. "MET is a pooled resource." "MET is daded Gagliard. "With its (Engler's) bond Issue, you'd pay each year on your income tax."
