"We provide them with newspa-pers and a bag lunch so that they can look for employment during the day," said Lillian Melville of the South Oakland Shelter, a 30-day shel-

The Baldwin Center in Pontiac, which is a 28-day shelter, provides sessions on budgeling money and food stamps, cooking sessions and child care programs. Medical checking are also available to those needing minor medical care. Local church organizations keep the children entertained by taking them to movies and other places, while their parcents are job hunting.

"We provide life changing activi-ties which are aimed at getting the bornel ess people back on their feet," said Pat Myers of the Baldwin Cen-ter.

People with severe cases of substance abuse and mental times also are turned away and referred to other shelters.


