

End holiday meal with festive cake

AP — Bursting with fresh orange and rich chocolate flavors, Passover Cocoa-Orange Sponge Cake is a festive ending to the traditional holiday meal.

The cake is made with cocoa, cake meal, potato starch and eggs. Almonds are baked into the top of the

cake. After baking, the cake is topped with a fresh orange glaze.

PASSOVER COCOA-ORANGE SPONGE CAKE:
1 cup sliced almonds
7 eggs, separated
1 1/4 cups sugar

1 tablespoon orange juice
1 teaspoon freshly grated orange peel
1/2 cup potato starch
1/2 cup cake meal
1/2 cup cocoa
Cocoa-Orange Glaze (recipe follows)

Heat oven to 300 degrees F. Line the bottom of a 10-inch tube pan with parchment paper. Sprinkle almonds evenly in pan.

In a large mixer bowl, beat egg yolks until the color of lemons. Gradually add 1 cup of the sugar, beating until thick. Stir in orange juice and peel.

Stir together potato starch, cake meal and cocoa, fold into yolk mixture.

In a separate bowl, beat egg whites until foamy. Gradually add remaining 1/2 cup sugar, beating un-

til stiff peaks form. Gently fold egg whites into yolk mixture. Pour into the prepared pan. Bake in a 300-degree F oven for 30 minutes.

Without opening the oven door, increase temperature to 325 degrees F. Bake 15 minutes or until top springs back when touched lightly. Cool 10 minutes, remove pan to wire rack. Gently peel off paper. Cool completely. Spread Cocoa-Orange Glaze over top. Remaining glaze can be served with cake. Makes 12 to 16 servings.

Cocoa-Orange Glaze: In a small saucepan, stir together 1 cup sweet orange marmalade, 1/4 cup cocoa and medium heat, stirring occasionally, until mixture boils. Strain; discard orange peel. Cool to room temperature. Makes about 1/2 cup glaze.

Sponge cake light, delicious

AP — This is a light, delicious cake with a delicate flavor and moist texture. It was developed by Susan Lynn of San Francisco's Square One restaurant.

SUSAN'S PASSOVER SPONGE CAKE:
10 eggs, separated
1 cup sugar
Zest and juice of 1 orange
Zest and juice of 1 lemon
Pinch of salt
1/2 cup plus 2 tablespoons Passover cake meal, sifted
1 1/2 tablespoons plus 2 teaspoons potato starch, sifted
1 teaspoon vanilla

mixture is pale and holds a ribbon. Beat the egg whites with the remaining 1/2 cup sugar and a pinch of salt until stiff. Fold the yolks into the whites. Then fold in the sifted cake meal, potato starch and vanilla.

Pour the batter into an ungreased 10-inch tube pan and put in a cold oven. Turn on the oven to 325 degrees F; bake for about 45 minutes. The cake is done when a toothpick inserted in the cake comes out clean. Invert to cool. Serve with fresh berries or fruit compote.
