For example, NBC, recently debuted Mann & Machine, a drama revolving around a female cybory police officer. Now ABC has produced a fall pilot called Running. Delilah, starring Kim Cattrall as a spy who is half-cyborg. Both stories focus on the characters' search for their human identity. Other-programming trends are found in the following projects being developed by the network.
