Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week:

### ATTEMPTED ARMED ROBBERY

A 31-year-old Farmington Hills man flagged down police after two unidentified men reportedly tried to hold him and his wife at gunpoint in their Cora Street driveway, Friday morning, according to a police report.

The man told police he and wife had just returned from Dearborn

Heights and were sitting in their car for several minutes in the driveway when two men approached on foot. Wielding a blue, steel handgun, one of the men said, "Get out of the car with your hands up." The other man stood silently.

The resident put his car in reverse, ducked down and backed of the driveway, beeping his car horn. The two men were left standing in the driveway.

At 10 Mile and Orchard Lake roads the resident flagged down police. The two unidentified men and the 1982 Buick they were driving

were seen on northbound Orchard Lake Road, from Westhill. Police stopped the pair at 10 Mile and Middlebelt. A handgun was not found.

One of the men, a 31-year-old Detroit resident was charged with driving with a suspended license. The other man was released.

### GAS LINE RUPTURE

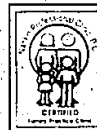
A gas line to a house on Howard Road was ruptured April 28 by a

**IN ARTHRITIS "NO PAIN, NO GAIN" MEANS A BIG ACHE**

If someone, even well meaning, tells you to exercise more despite your arthritis, because "no pain, no gain," ignore the advice.

Why?

Exercise to tone and stretch is good for muscles, but a slow you decrease their strength and stamina. However, putting more on joints than they can take only damages them.
