

Prep Track Ratings

Farmington, Franklin and Redford Union divided honors in the final Observerland track ratings for 1971.

The powerful Falcons placed 17 in the final list with Franklin and RU second with 13 each followed by Thurston with 12.

RU's Roger Blanchard, who scored a height of 14' 8 1/2" in the regionals at Belleville, didn't set a state record but he did win the championship with a height of 14' 4".

Roger was the only state champion from the Observerland schools in the class A meet in East Lansing.

Mike Jancet, Franklin's fleet quarter-miler, finished fourth with a school record clocking of :48.7.

Farmington's Mike McGlothlin wound up second in the mile in the spectacular clocking of 4:17.1 and teammate Kim Hildebrandt was timed in 1:56.7 in the 800-yard run for a third place.

Kot Everett, of RU, had his best showing in the long jump at the regionals when he leaped 21' 9".

Canham Next Big 10 Chief?

Although he steadfastly insists he is not a candidate for the position it is a foregone conclusion that Don Canham, Michigan's athletic director, will be given serious consideration as the successor to Bill Reed, the Big Ten Commissioner, who died last week.

Even before Reed's final illness, Canham was prominently mentioned as a candidate for the job that has been held by only three other men—Jed, John L. Griffith (1922-1944) Kenneth (Tug) Wilson (1945-1961) and Reed.

THE ONE STUMBLING block in Canham's elevation to the commissionership is the fact that he has a lucrative business in Ann Arbor and there may be some doubt that he would want to move.

This subject came up in the Michigan press box during the final spring practice scrimmage and one of the top officials remarked,

"Don is so much of a salesman that he'll have the Big Ten move the commissioner's office to Ann Arbor—and don't be surprised that it won't happen."

He revamped the football department by bringing in "Bo" Schembechler as head coach and the team went to the Rose Bowl in the first year.

Next, he had tartan turf installed not only in the stadium, but on the practice fields as well. He had the baseball field improved and re-named as Fisher Field in honor of the veteran coach. Then came the demolition of the old concrete stands, final

link with legendary Ferry Field "where Heston trod" and now he is in the midst of building a monument to football—a sort of gathering place for the graders and their trophies.

ON THE BUSINESS side his promotion activities have caused football attendance to jump from an average of 60,000 to 72,000. And he has established a new type contract for the renewal of the old concrete stands, final

is now being used as a model by other schools.

He has been a leader in all Big Ten power-words and has helped the officials to remedy several sticky problems during the past two years.

All these accomplishments have been piling up in the minds of the men who will have to select a new commissioner within the next 30 days.

And that's why they'll be taking a long look at Don Canham.

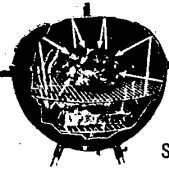
