# Outside storage law gets placed on hold

Farmington officials have placed a moratorium on enforcement of the city's 17-year-old outside storage ordinance, until the law can be re-studied and possibly amended.

A subcommittee of city officials comprised of planning commissioners, city council members and board of zoning members have been studying the issue for the past six months, after some business owners raised concerns about the law passed in September of 1974. Several businesses had received temporary variances, allowing them to store outside materials at their locations, and say they cannot comply. The city had studied problems related to outside storage in industrial districts along Eight Mile and Nine Mile roads since July of 1989.

The subcommittee has asked the full planning commission consider:

- The BZA be allowed to authorize a two-year variance for spe-

cial outside storage cases to run through June of 1994. Thereafter the properties would be required to comply with the new law. The current law allows for six-month temporary variances.

- The city consider permitting "small equipment rental" businesses within the industrial district, with adequate maintenance provisions.

- Expand the definition of pollutants to include tracking devices used to transport goods and materials. Also, that pollutants be allowed to be stored in areas other than the rear if areas are screened.

- Reasonable outside storage be allowed for the city.

City council members agreed to a moratorium on enforcement of the law at their May 4 meeting. They now await their planning commission study and recommendations.


