First on the agenda is a public hearing for the proposed budget and tax rate for fiscal year 1992-93.

Light petitions and communication, the council will consider sign variables for 2002-03 Farmington Road and 20740 Farmington Road; correspondence from SEMCO regarding Farmington Hills Community Development Block Grant program funding; consider a site plan approval for an addition to non-conforming building at 25014 Grand River, and consider a request for an outside sales permit for 35271 Grand River, the Fresh Approach Market. Also to be considered is a request for proclamation for Pause for the Pledge of Allegiance Day on June 14.

The city attorney will offer a report on Oakland County's objection

to the 1992-93 City of Detroit proposed coverage rates.

The city manager will offer a proposed amendment to the city's sewer ordinance, request contractor payments for the city's sewer improvement project, propose a summer city council schedule, give a report on the Oakland County Inter-governmental Agreement and offer amendments to the city's fee schedule.

Reports will also be given on the public safety department and for the six-year capital improvement program for 1992-97.
