Bloomin' Rochester art fair events drawing near

The Point Creek Center for the Arts will sponsor an outdoor Bloomin' Rochester art fair 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday, May 30, at the intersection of Fourth and Walnut in downtown Rochester.

This invitational show will feature Michigan artists who use flowers, gardens, garden sculpture and related subjects. Thirty-five artists from Potoskey to Rochester will offer

flower paintings, nature photographs, bird and fish sculpture, pottery, planters, wind chimes, jewelry, wearable art and more.

The PCCA art fair will be one of many activities that comprise the daylong event, "Bloomin' Rochester: A Festival of Art and Flowers," sponsored by the Downtown Rochester Promotion and Marketing Partnership.

Additional art activities will include an outdoor ceramic firing and indoor art demonstrations at the PCCA, 407 Pine, one block west of the art fair. Furniture designers, artists decorate show house

Scott Shuprine Furniture designers have been selected to decorate the great hall area of the Junior League of Detroit's 1992 Designer Show House, a magnificent 26-room Grosse Pointe Tudor built in 1918 by Joseph Jeremiah and Jennie E. Crowley.

In conjunction with the show house, Detroit Focus Gallery is presenting "Sculpture in the Garden," an exhibition of art in an outdoor setting. The display encompasses a

variety of media, including ceramic, stone, metal and wood, and a range of artistic styles. Participating artists are Mark Chatterly, Jerome Ferretti, Gary S. Griffin, Gary Kulok, Charles McGee, Tom Phairick, Robert Sestok, Lois Teicher, Hugh Timlin, Joseph Wesner and Gary Zych.

The show house is at 243 Lakeland, adjacent to the house of Joseph's brother, Daniel, co-founder of Crowley, Milner and Co. It will be open to the public to May 31. Hours are 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Tuesday-Friday, noon to 5 p.m. Sunday and Memorial Day, 6:30-8:30 p.m. Wednesday-Friday. No children under 8 admitted.

"Tickets are available through the Junior League of Detroit at 881-0040. Tickets are \$10 at the door and \$6 for groups of 15 or more.

THE HOUSE'S dramatic great hall area includes the foyer, warming room and main staircase.

"The masters' feeling of this unique space suggested replication of the great halls found in Europe," said Pat Zatina, buyer and designer for Scott Shuprine. "With this in mind, we wanted to create an area that is reminiscent of a rich and opulent English estate. However, at the same time, we wanted to add a warmer, fresher feeling that will welcome and embrace visitors to the show house."
