## Bill Aims At Juvenile Problems

In an effort to curb juvenile delinquency, U.S. Congressman Jack McDonald (R-Farmington) introduced legislation that would create an institute for Continuing Studies of Juvenile Justice.

"The thrust of the institute will be to disseminate information and expertise in the field of juvenile delinquency treatment and control," he said.

"And secondly, it will provide training for people at the state and local levels in the newest and most effective methods of treatment and control of juvenile offenders."

McDonald said the institute will try to reduce the number of repeat offenses and will explore the role of drugs in crime.
