# CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE

NOTICE OF ADDITION OF ORDINANCE C-29-27, an ordinance to amend the Code of Ordinances. Only of Farmington Illis, Michigan, by adding a new artifice, Article VI., to Capter 17. Nutsiance, to regulate the maintenance of compost piles in residential areas of the City and provide penalties for the violation of the ordinance.

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS ORDAINS:

Section 1. Chapter 17, Nuisances, of the City Code is hereby amended to add Article VI, Compost Piles, Residential Areas, which shall read as follows:

17.80 Compost Piles, Residential Areas.

(a) Compost piles can be maintained on private property, provided there is appliance with the provisions of subsection (b) below:

(b) (1) Compost plier may include a combination of organic yard and garden natic, such as weeds, branches, back, grass clipplings, stalks and stems, brush er vines.

(2) Compost plier shall not be located within any drafnage easement; Compost plies shall not be located in any front yard or any side yard or closer than ten feet (10°) to any property line.

(3) Compost plies shall not exceed four feet by eight feet (4° x 8°) or six feet (6°) in diameter and shall not exceed four feet (4°) in height. Double compost plies may be utilized, provided the totals size does not exceed the above.

(1) Coping plies shall be maintained so that there are no readily apparent odors emanating onto adjacent property.

(c) In addition to any costs which may be assessed purisuant to subjection (d) ow, any violation of this article shall subject the violator to a civil fine of not citabn 100-00.

(d) In addition to the enforcement of this article as a civil infraction as wided in subsection (b) above, this article may also be enforced in the same near as provided in Chapter 17.
