The auditorium was full of loving, mature faces. The smell of coffee in the air. Sweet anticipation was rewarded as our darling little ones marched and wriggled into the room.

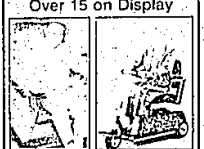
"Grandparent's Day at Larkshire Elementary"

Tape visuals very slowly and include some footage close enough to see the costumes. Keep in mind the background and props for colorful presentation.

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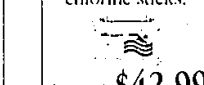

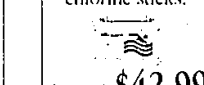
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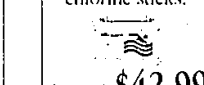

"I never ate caviar!"

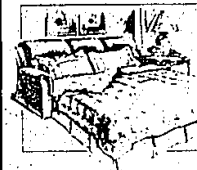
