If you're looking for a place you can take your whole family to eat, look no further than Rochester Cafe. Owned and operated by the Aiello family, Rochester Cafe features home cooked breakfast, lunch and dinner in a comfortable, casual friendly atmosphere.

They've earned a reputation for their delicious Deep Dish Sicilian Pizza, savory homemade soups, and desserts like Dutch Apple and Milky Way pie.

"We want our customers to sit and relax and enjoy a good meal," said owner Anthony Aiello. His wife, Rosemary, and son, Mark also work at the restaurant. "We take care of things. One of us is always here," said Mark. Three years ago they remodeled the restaurant, formerly a Sugoet.

Floral tablecloths, paintings, and a graphic design on the windows help create the comfortable setting.

There's something for everyone on the menu. Rochester Cafe recently got a liquor license, and offers beer, wine and cocktails. House specialties include Anthony's Italian Favorites, like veal piccata and Chicken Siciliano — breaded breast of chicken, scented with herbs and spices served with an authentic amorphia sauce, (fresh chopped tomatoes, Italian herbs and spices.) Dinners are served with soup or salad, vegetable of the day, choice of potato or spaghetti and homemade bread baked.

There's also old fashioned like baked meatloaf, chicken orzo, steak, and seafood on the menu. Kids will love the menu for children ages 10 and under which features a junior hamburger,

grilled cheese with french fries, and chicken fillet strips dinner.

For those counting calories and watching their cholesterol, Rochester Cafe offers a Heart Wise menu recommended by the Atallah Heart Center in Rochester. Senior citizens age 55 and older get a 10 percent discount.

Characters in the Livorno-Redford Theatre Guild's "Albertine in Five Times" remind one of a fine crystal that has fractured into ugly deformed pieces of glass.

As we learn about each piece, their rough edges seem softer. Indeed, the crystal slowly appears to become whole again. Not perfect to be sure. Stress

cracks remain permanently etched. There is, however, beauty in understanding the life of a woman who has endured more than her share of pain. It is a show not to be missed.

Five actresses play Albertine at five different times in her life. Director, Jeffrey Nahan, does a fine job of staging playwright, Michael Tremblay's, challenging script. His vast, intensely naturalistic five visions of one personality. We see them as Albertine's memories, just after she enters a home for the elderly.

Shirley Hulet is marvelous as Albertine at 70. One moment she's a wise, smiling slowly aging woman, the next she's conflicted with fearful, painful

memories. At long last she has reached the age of understanding.

As crises develop, she tries to advise those playing herself in earlier years. As has been the case for centuries, they never listen.

Barbara Coven scores as a youthful Albertine at 30, whose natural optimism has been tempered by a wayward husband and troubled children. Unable to communicate, she takes out her frustration by nearly beating her daughter to death over a sexual encounter.

Cheryl Roy gives a mesmerizing performance as a bitter, joyless Albertine at 40. Her husband foolishly gotten himself killed; her daughter's a tramp, her son is mentally impaired. All she

ever wanted was to be loved. To be understood. Instead life dealt her a deck of losing cards. No wonder she is an empty shell of a woman, full of rage, with a perpetual sarcastic smile.

Pat Varga very effectively shows another side of Albertine at 50. She chooses to set herself free. Her attitude: If you don't like something, make up a new past. She places her son in a home. Gets a job as a waitress, but there are memories, always memories.

Maurice Cook is most sympathetic as Albertine at 60. By now she is a pill-popping, bedridden recluse. Memories linger on. And she fears that one night the guilt will be too much — and she will take one too many pills.

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
