"I think we're still a hometown nestled in here," he added. "It's still the old high school. I think adults view it that way and the kids view it that way too."

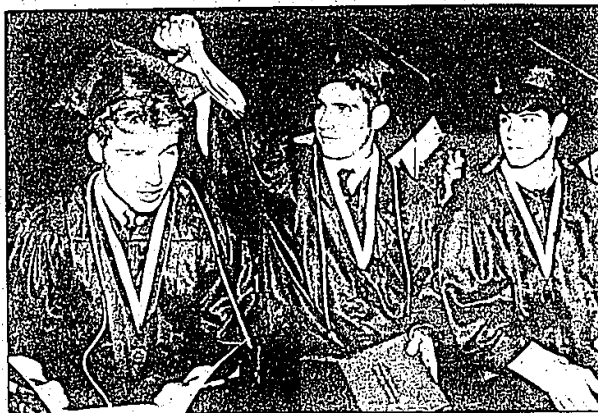

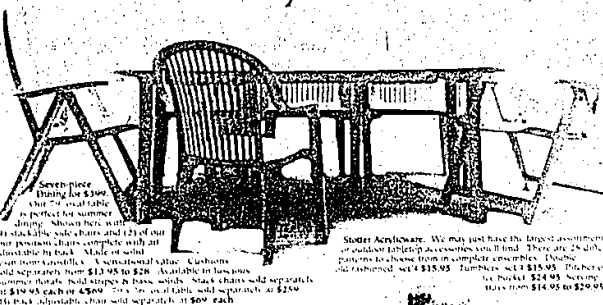
