as August.

This is the month that Julius Caesar modestly named after himself. He had modified the old Roman calendar, which began in March on the first day of spring, by introducing the lesp-year.

He took what was then the fifth month and named it for himself. His successor, Augustus, refusing to be outdone by his illustrious uncle, put his own name on the following month!

All five of the naked-eye planets will be viable this month, in theory. Mars is visible in the pre-dawn sky; Mercury, Jupiter and Saturn are visible after sunset. In fact, Mercury puts in its best evening appearance for the entire year this month. Venus "officially" becomes an evening object late in the month, but It will be difficult to see.

Sunrise was at 6 a.m. on July 1, and sunset is at 9:17 pm. That will allow for a possible 16 hours and 17 minutes of sun. On July 31 these times are 6:29 a.m. and 28 minallowing for 14 hours and 28 min-

utes of sunlight, a decrease of 49

utes of sunlight, a decrease of 49 minutes.

The moon is fairly easy to find on the evening of the 2nd, with Mercupi 10 degrees (29 moon diameters) to its right.

The earth is at aphelion on July 3. We are at our farthest distance from the sun 152,102,000 kilometers (44,511,180 miles). It comes as a uprifact to some people that we have warm summer weather when we are at aphelion. The distance to the sun is not what causes our seasons; the tilt of the earth does.

Triangles in sky

The moon forms a large triangle with Regulus (REG u lus) and Jupiter on the evening of the 3rd. Regulus, the 'heart' of Leo the lion, is not as bright as Jupiter. Regulus is a star, it makes its own light. The planet Jupiter reflects the light of the sun. By the following night the moon has passed Jupiter and a different triangle with Regulus is formed.

If you draw a line from Jupiter through Regulus and extend it to the horizon, on the 5th, you will go right past Mercury. That planet is now six degrees above the horizon. By the end of the month Mercury will no longer be visible. It is at its maximum elongation (greatest apparent angle) from the sun on the 6th, located 26 degrees to the left of the sun.


