Not only did he paint, but he learned to play seven instruments, of which drums were his forte, and wrote more than 200 poems. He took courses at what is now the Center for Creative Studies. He accomplished the equivalent of a life's work between the ages of 34 and 41. His love of art drove him to complete 40 paintings in various media and more than 1,000 sketches. A native Detroit, he became a pharmacologist and worked as a re-
