ness. "I tell you one thing, I get into work long before 8:30 a.m. (when court is expected to begin)." Gabel spent some time in 47th District Court a few weeks ago. "I saw people sitting in the courtroom for about an hour. Sometimes things hoppen. But I think you as a judge have a responsibility to be there (on time)." To avoid delays, Gabel would experiment with scheduling people or cases in 15 minute intervals. "It would help keep things orderly. People slaw owuldn't have to take a whole day off from work or from their children (to wat in court)." He believes the 47th District Court needs a third judge — something the state Legislature opposed this year. If elected, Gabel said he would labby with legislators for a

He sees two good-sized courtrooms that perhaps could be reduced to provide room for other needs. "To save money, they might be able to move some walls.
