South rallies to win 15th

South Farmington ran its record to 15-1 in the Kousfus Division of the Little Caesars Baseball Federation, rallying for five runs in the seventh inning Friday to defeat Dearborn West 7-2.

The winning rally began with a leadoff single by Dan McLaughlin. Mike Dugan's run-scoring triple was followed by Jake Siskosky's RBI single.

After a walk to Greg Call and a hit by C.J. Gannam, Joe Kalczynski drove in another run with a fielder's choice, and Marty Wilk capped the rally with a two-run double.

Gannam pitched the last two innings to get the win. Dearborn (12-4) loaded the bases with no outs in the seventh, but Gannam escaped the tight spot with a popout and two strikeouts.

Wilk pitched five strong innings before Gannam entered. Call and Kalczynski drove in South's first two runs. Siskosky and Wilk had

two hits each.

On Thursday, South overcame a 5-4 deficit with a four-run fourth inning, rallying in which Kalczynski and Wilk had the big hits with a pair of two-run singles.

BACK ARTHRITIS

Pain in the wrist, shoulder and knee is treated with anti-inflammatory drugs, injections, and when applicable, with surgery. Why not treat arthritis of the back the same way?

There are two reasons why the same treatment does not apply. First, the back is different. The shoulder, wrist, and knee are meant to move, but the joints of the back are designed to hold you up. Thus the back parts have more bone, different cartilage, and test joint space than the joints in front. The chemical and structural nature of the back often renders joint medications ineffective.

Second, much of back pain designated "arthritis" really presents the very findings of aging. No medicine can reverse such change. Furthermore, pain labeled as the result of arthritis often comes from muscle and ligament strain, conditions the anti-inflammatory drugs do not handle well.

Specific arthritis of the back exists and includes ankylosing spondylitis, osteoporosis, and infectious arthritis. However, these entities have characteristics that allow physicians to differentiate them from "back arthritis."

Treatment for most back pain consists of heat, judicious use of rest and activity, and reassurance that you are not hiding a cancer or developing a crippling condition. Resolution of such pain depends more on time and nature than medication.

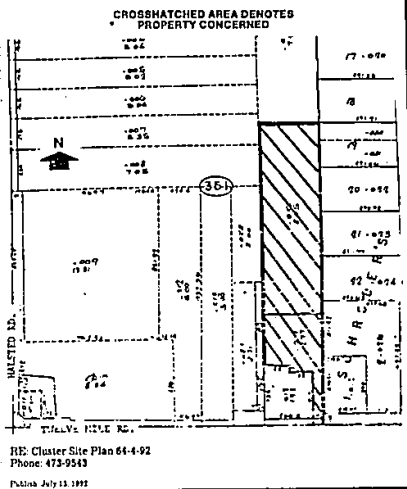
