

The Oakland University Continuum Center will offer an evening workshop, "How to Handle Difficult People," on Wednesday, July 22, from 7-10 p.m. on campus.


Communications specialist Roberta Dailey will present ways to effectively manage repeatedly disa-greeable people by learning to man-
