Cub Uniforms, Anyone?

Mrs. Leon Pope, a leader for both Cub Scouts and Brownies, thinks parents of both should get an equal break when it comes to buying uniforms for the young fry.

So the Plymouth mother of four is heading a move to establish an exchange and resale service for the expensive but uniforms worn by small cubs in local families.

WHAT CATHERINE POPE has in mind is the kind of swap that has been established by Girl Scout organizations in the

various communities in the area. Under the system, outgrown brown and green uniforms can be exchanged for other used ones to get a better fit. Or mothers can just buy or sell instead of exchanging.

But Mrs. Pope hadn't heard of anything like that for Cub Scout garb, and neither had any of the ladies in her den mother training class that meets each Wednesday evening in John Glenn High School, Wayne.

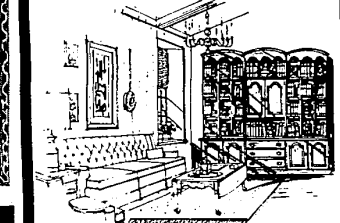
