

Covenant Mission Series Set

The Rev. Paul W. Anderson, executive secretary of home missions for the Evangelical Covenant Church in America, will conduct a fall preaching mission starting at 7:45 p.m. Friday, Oct. 18, at the Evangelical Covenant church located at 24331 W. Eight Mile.

The series will conclude with services Sunday, Oct. 20, when he will speak at 10:45 a.m. and 7 p.m.

The Rev. Edwin T. Clemens is pastor of the local church. Rev. Anderson was born in Minneapolis. He is a graduate of Minnesota Academy and of North Park College and Theological Seminary, and also has studied at Fresno State Teachers College in California.

For four years (1963-1967) previous to his assuming the office of Executive Secretary of Home Missions of the Covenant Church, he served as superintendent of the Northwest Conference. He has held pastorates in four Covenant churches, South Bend, Indiana 1934-1940; Fresno, California 1940-1947; Muskegon, Michigan 1947-1956; and San Jose, California 1956-1963.

Rev. Anderson has served the Covenant as chairman of the Christian Citizenship Committee; the Board of Christian Education; the Board of Missions; and the Board of Ministerial Standing.



Ohio Pastor Leads Revival In Kenwood

The Rev. Max R. Hickerson, of Cincinnati, will be guest evangelist Oct. 20 to 25 in what may be the last revival meeting the Kenwood Church of Christ holds in its old white building.

The church, purchased by Kenwood from St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran in 1954, is located on Middle Belt just north of the Livonia Mall. The congregation plans to build a new facility soon.

Rev. Hickerson is minister of the Cloverknob Christian Church in Cincinnati. Special activities, besides preaching, in the Christian ministry, he studied at Lincoln Christian College, in Illinois, Ozark Bible College in Missouri and The Cincinnati Bible Seminary.

Editors of the "Outstanding Young Men of America" named him to their publication in 1966. He is currently serving as national chairman of Public Relations for the North American Christian Convention, an annual gathering which is expected to bring some 20,000 persons to Detroit's Cobo Hall in July, 1969.

He will preach Sunday, Oct. 20, at the 11 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. services, Monday through Friday services will begin at 7:30 p.m. In addition to enthusiastic congregational singing, music will be provided by the Caroleers Trio, Lee and the Caroleers, a new men's trio from the Kenwood church, and other groups. There will be a staffed nursery, and also planned program for children aged two through five.

Blind Choir Sings In Ward

The Hong Kong Blind choir, sponsored by Chinese for Christ, will be at the Ward Memorial Presbyterian Church of Livonia at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 17.

Foreign Mission Gifts Asked Of Area Catholics

Catholics who in April donated over a million dollars to help lower-city residents in the Detroit area will be asked Oct. 20 to give another half-million dollars for foreign missions, hospitals, orphanages, schools, homes for the aged, leper care and other programs conducted principally in underdeveloped nations.

The goal was set by the Archdiocese of Detroit Mission Sunday campaign director, the Rev. Father James A. Moloney, who predicted that it would be fulfilled when the special collection is completed Oct. 20.

"The Oct. 20 observance of Mission Sunday is worldwide," Father Moloney said, "and certainly must be counted as one of the most religious and humanitarian undertakings of this century. Extra interest has been gained for it this year by urgent requests from Vietnam and because of the appeal of Pope Paul VI, which emphasized the importance of the church's mission activity and the need to support it generously."

THE COLLECTION, expected to reach about \$16,000,000 nationally, is administered by the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. In addition to religious programs it conducts a great variety of projects in nearly every area of the globe.

Typical activities, besides conducting orphanages and hospitals, include a battle on illiteracy in Africa, housing help for the homeless in Latin America and medical care to tribes-

Instead, the Federation suggested to its sponsors and contributors that they send an all-purpose special occasion card, which is used throughout the year when a donor wishes to make a contribution to mark a friend's birthday, anniversary or other special occasion.

The holiday spirit is one of giving, the notice emphasizes, and therefore the card that tells the donor's friend that a contribution is being made to SCF in his name is appropriate the year-round.

CHRISTMAS and Chanukah gifts in this form have been a popular custom among Save the Children sponsors.

The letter advising that the holiday gift cards are being discontinued because of increasing costs suggests that the holiday custom be continued as an expression of "good will and hope to underprivileged children and their families around the world."
