2 Leaders Earn GS Medals

Two Redford Township Girl Scout leaders will receive the St. Anne medal when the Archdiocesan Catholic Committee on Girl Scouting holds its annual leaders institute Friday, Oct. 25, in the Gabriel Richard building, Detroit.

Mrs. Barbara Ann Lawson, of St. Robert Bellarmine, and Mrs. Marian Wilkerson, of St. Agatha, will receive the medal, highest honor that the leader of a Girl Scout unit can earn for her success in emphasizing the spiritual ideals of the movement by her teaching and her personal example.

Both have contributed long unpaid service to Girl Scout units under Catholic auspices in the Archdiocese. They have filled a wide range of responsible positions, including troop leader, neighborhood chairman, troop organizer, trainer, badge consultant, den mother, council delegate, and committee woman.

Eight other women in the Detroit area also are members of the honors class.

Two More Sermons Set

Two additional "birth control encyclical" sermons have been scheduled by the University of Detroit.

The Rev. Norman McKendrick, S.J., U.O.D. director of religious activities, announced that the three recent University Sermon Series commentaries on Pope Paul's "Humanae Vitae" will be supplemented on Oct. 20 and Oct. 27.

"This University Sermon Series at the Student Mass at noon on Sundays," Fr. McKendrick said, "is designed to provide the sort of authoritative commentary on contemporary and significant topics which is the special province and responsibility of a university original."

"In my original invitation to the theology faculty of the university to provide commentary on the encyclical I set no limitations as to the number of sermons."
