Commencement exercises for Clarenceville High School seniors will be held on Thursday, June 17, with Dr. Richard W. Waite as keynote speaker. Dr. Waite is associate professor of educational foundations and counselor for teachers college at Marshall University, Huntington, W. Va.

Baccalaureate address, "You've Come a Long Way," will be delivered by the Rev. Elsie Johns, for many years pastor of Clarenceville's United Methodist Church. Baccalaureate services will be held Sunday, June 13.

Both programs will be held in the Louis E. Schmidt Auditorium beginning at 8 p.m.

DR. WAITE earned a BS in education from Ohio State University, his master's from Indiana University and took his doctorate from the University of Michigan in guidance and counseling.

He taught in secondary schools in Michigan, California and Ohio before joining the faculty of Marshall University in 1968. At Marshall he teaches on both graduate and undergraduate levels.

A native of Calumet, Rev. Johns came to Clarenceville in 1941 when her church had no members. She conducted services the first five Sundays with no one in attendance. In 1958 the church purchased 8½ acres on Middle Belt between Seven and Eight Mile roads and constructed a \$300,000 edifice.

For the first 15 years she spent in Clarenceville, Miss Johns served as part-time pastor and the last 15 years as full-time pastor. She graduated from Highland Park High School in 1923 and attended Hamline University in St. Paul, Minn.

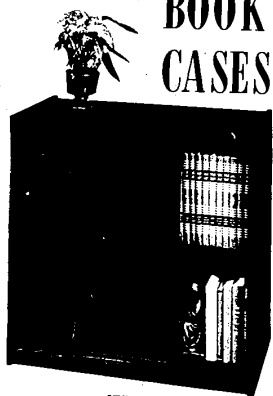

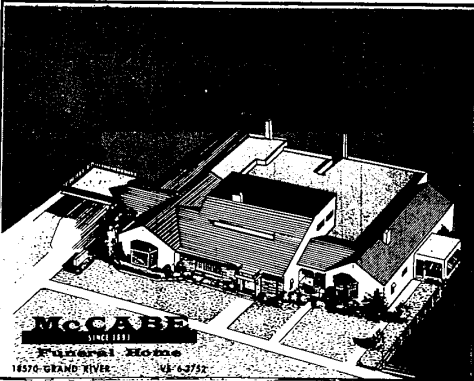
