nity service to be done on company time. "We think our employees have a responsibility to participate in community life," said human resources director Mary Menz, a West Bloomfield resident. "It's tough to find time to do it on their own time."

"So this is perfect — we pay them as part of the work day. It's been a very worthwhile program. It's been an eye-opening experience for them."

Westland resident Kay LeRoy, paymaster at the Hyatt who helped on a recent camp outing to Kensington Metropark, said she likes the experience. "I enjoy the kids and let them enjoy themselves — it feels good," she said.

Rowland, who works at a Salvation Army early childhood day care center in Southfield during non-summer months, said he started as a summer camp counselor and is directing camp for the first time this year. "I've been involved with Salvation Army day camps since I was 15," he said.

Most of the kids attending camp range in age from 5 to 12 and come from Farmington, Farmington Hills and Southfield, though they don't have to be a resident to attend.

With the exception of the weekly field trips, camp is held on site at the Shawwassee Road location just west of Inkster. This year, two three-week sessions were scheduled.

CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN ZONING AMENDATORY ORDINANCE ORDINANCE NO. C-29-92

An Ordinance to amend the City Code, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, of the City of Farmington Hills, to amend Section 34.32 to reclassify certain property as hereinafter mentioned.

The City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, hereby ordains:

- Section 1. That the City Code of the City of Farmington Hills, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, is hereby amended in part to amend Section 34.32 to reclassify certain property in the City as follows to show SP-1, Special Purpose District classification where RA-1, One-Family Residential District classification is now shown in the area described as follows:
- No. 23-09-300-003
TIN, R&E, Section 9, City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, having an address of 35100 Twelve Mile Road, located on the northeast corner of Drake and Twelve Mile Roads.
- Section 2. All ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.
 - Section 3. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect twenty-one days after their enactment.
 - Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to have been adopted by the Council Members of the City of Farmington Hills, at a duly called meeting held on the 20th day of July, 1992, and ordered to be given publication in the manner prescribed by law.
