Scam aimed at area businesses prompts warning from police

STAFF WHITER Formington police are warning businesses and residentis to be aware of an opparent scata which has already targeted at least two Jusinesses in the city in recent weeks. According to Commander Chuck Lee of the Farmington Department of Public Safety, one local business is out \$225 after falling prey last week to a com man who said he was a state trooper and feigned an emer-gency. gency.

According to Lee, a man called the business on Eight Mile Road, identified binnself as a police trooper and told the owner that his business partner had been in an ou-tomobile accident in Lansing. The caller went on to explain that the injured man had no identification

or money, and had asked the police to call and have money wired by his

partner. The Farmington businessman re-The Farmington husinessman re-alized what had happened when he called his partner's wife to find out door the injuries and aubsequent huspitalization, and the partner an-swered the phone. The money was picked up at a New York Western Union station within half an hour from the time the wire transfer was made, Lee said.

apporently claim Western Union money anywhere in the country, which makes the problem even more difficult to trace. In a second Parmington case, a business warman hecome suspicious and contacted the police after get-ting a call. The state police post in Northville is also working on two similar cases. Northville is also working on two similar case. "This is the fourth case I know of," said Lee. "One (caller) even gave a name and is badge number." Lee suggests residents verify any mergency before sending money of any kind, and be aware that police agencies will not request humps in this way. "Don't wire any money unless you know it's valid," he added. Although husinesses appear to be the main target, Lee warns resi-dents to be aware of the problem as well.
