Police cadet promoted to officer

Farmington Hills police cadet Scott Cronin has been promoted to the rank of police officer as of July 1.

At the city council's insistence, a police officer's position was added to the 1992-93 budget. Originally,

the proposed budget, adopted June 1, did not include any additional personnel.

Cronin has been a member of the Farmington Hills department since July 1989 when he was hired as a cadet. During his tenure he was

elected by his peers as employee of the month. He was also awarded a civilian citation for his role in an undercover assignment involving a conspiracy to commit forgery, said Farmington Hills police Chief William Dwyer.

Cronin is studying criminal jus-

tice at Madonna University. In August he will attend the Oakland Police Academy for 11 weeks and will participate in the department's field training officer's program. Cronin is the son of Ronald Cronin, West Bloomfield Township police chief.

Law helps shops

Shopping areas — that often compete with large urban malls for customers — were given a boost recently when Gov. John Engler signed into law legislation sponsored by Sen. Michael Bouchard, R-Birmingham.

The new law will allow principal shopping districts, designated areas that are predominantly commercial and contain at least 10 retail businesses, to promote economic activity by maintaining walkways, highways and parking lots, regulating traffic and engaging in promotional activities.
