Drug czar wants to reduce appeals for pleading guilty

The state's drug ezar says Michi-can could save \$2 million by reduc-ing the number of automatic

appeals by convicts.

Robert Peterson, coordinator of drug programs for Gov, John Engler, supports a constitutional amendment to eliminate automatic appeals by people who plead guilty.
"We should abolish the automat

oppeals by people who plead gullty. "We should abolish the automatic right to appeal guilty pleas. Many countest plead guilty and are not bappy with the sentence," Peterson said after testifying before a Senate subcommittee. "We could asve \$400,000 in attorneys costs, plas the cost of defense attorneys. The Supreme Court estimates the swings at \$2 million." George Ward, chief ossistant Wayne County prosecutor running for the Court of Appeals, agrees. "There diseast have to be a three-year backlog in the Court of Appeals, by the own procedures, generates frivolous appeals. A quarter of the docket is frivolous.

"Under the Michigan Constitution, a defendant has rights — the
right to a jury, to witnesses, the
right of appeal. The effect of a
pulty plea is to walve those rights,
But we have a rule that you don't
walve a right in an appellate court
proceeding.
"At an earlier time, they (Court of
Appeals) wanted to generate a case
load. Even if a defendant specifically
waives the right to appeal, they
(court) won't enforce it.
"We could still have a rule that
defendant could apply for leave to
appeal if something outrageous
happened."

District Judge Edward Plawecki
Jr., another Court of Appeals candidate, said such a constitutional
amendment "would reduce the

backlog — definitely, It would take some pressure off (for new judges) and save the state attorneys' fees for indigents."
Plawecki, of Dearborn Heighta, said "20 percent of appeals are friv-olous — where the individual, after belong fully represented, pleads guitty and waives his rights."

Appellant-convicts are entitled to
file a 35-page brief and usually use
the entire 35 pages. The prosecutor
who sent them to prison usually
uses his full 35 pages for rebuttal.
Appealant-convicts charge such
irregularities as inadequate legal
counsel or too stiff a sentence by
the judge.


The Court of Appeals rules against all but a few appeals. But it still takes a three-judge panel—plus clerks, time and paper—to produce written opinions.

The Court of Appeals was created by the 1963 state constitution with nine judges. Today it has 24 and a three-year backlog. The Supreme Court administrator has asked for 0 judges by 1994 and sold there is work for 80 judges.

Lawmakers, however, are leaning in the direction of cutting the work-load by cutting automatic appeals.
