Anti-female remarks

Results from Tuesday's county executive primary might not end the controversy surrounding Democratic candidate Philip Marcuse and his allegedly anti-female campaign statements. Attorney Mary Dresbach said she believed the statement should disqualify Marcuse from serving as a court clerk.

Marcuse was quoted in a July 23
Observer & Eccentric article as saying: "Women are not leaders, they're supporters," in comparing his candidacy with that of Democratic rival Elizabeth Howe. Judge O'Brien."

O'Brien was out of the country as
of deadline and unavailable for
comment, a spokeswoman said.
Marcuse first said he didn't make
any such statement.

"That would have been a foolish

ously untrue," he said in a letter sent to Observer & Eccentric offices the day the article appeared.

"I said that I thought the gifts compromise were best suited to the legislative area and not the execu-

tive."
However, in later statements to other media, he amplified his reported comments.

"I can overlook what he's because he apparently doesn't know any better," Howe said. "But that a circuit court judge would allow this in his office... Why wouldn't Judge O'Brien have told him, 'Why don't you debate the issues?"

Attorney seeks court clerk's ouster Dresbach said Marcuse' state...) ment pointed to a bigger problem, : "open and obvious hostility toward women" in courtrooms.


But while Birmingham-based attorney Shirley Saltzman, president of the Oakland County Women's Marcuse's statements, she disagreed they were part of a larger problem.

"I haven't found it to be true;" she said. "I know that of the few times I was before Judge O'Brien' my clients and I were treated well."

As for Marcuse — in his letter he claimed to he the victim of a media double standard.
