of topics in a developmental way. LEAP and KEAP classes include topics in geography, science and math. Because all activities are theme-based, even the stories and songs included in a day's lesson relate to the topic of the day.

Parental involvement is also part of both classes. "Parental involvement in young children's education has a positive effect on academic motivation," said teacher Sue Williams. "We encourage our parents

to become as active as they wish in our activities.

LEAP and KEAP meet for 1½ hours, one day each week. Morning or afternoon classes are offered. The tuition-based classes begin in mid-September but the district recommends interested parents begin enrolling in mid-August.

Because of his disorder Brett walked later than a typical toddler and Terri Marquardt said that was because of therapy offered through MDA programs.

The Hills Fire Department has sponsored a team in the Founders Festival Bed Race each of the four years it has been held in downtown Farmington prior to the Founders Festival parade. They have won first place in the last two years.

Bed race teams pay an entry fee, are usually sponsored by a group or business, and also do fund-raising prior to the race to get donations to the MDA.

MDA district director Kim Sidwell said the Farmington race raised just under \$1,000 this year. Money given to the MDA goes for equipment like braces, walkers and wheelchairs, various family support groups and physical therapy clinics.
