

A Play, Good Book Can Be Fun

FARMINGTON The boing and jeering finally died down.

Wizard William's plans were typically foiled. Henry Hedgecove married the princess and all lived happily ever after in "The Polkadotted Dragon's Tale," performed by the Farmington Players at the second annual Young Authors Conference held by Farmington schools.

Some of the young authors were so young (kindergartners through sixth graders) that they had never seen a live stage play before. From the sound of things in the Farmington Senior High auditorium, they loved it, boing the villain, cheering the hero and becoming thoroughly involved in the fantasy of it all.

Over 400 elementary school children studying creative writing and their parents attended the conference. Before the play they browsed through several displays of books, stories, plays, essays and poetry written by students. There were even some samples of "Hail ku" poetry, a Japanese form using a different verse pattern from the English sonnet and written specifically about nature.

Carolyn Mahalak, reading specialist at Larkshire Elementary School, coordinated this year's program. "The idea was to recognize the talent of these young children and bring them together to see how and what other students are writing about," she said. There were no prizes

awarded—"it's not a contest," said Mrs. Mahalak. Youngsters who demonstrated writing ability were chosen to represent their classes. The

second annual Young Authors Conference was presented with the cooperation of all the reading specialists in Farmington Elementary Schools.
