Milosevic in Belgrade, civilians are doing what they can. That includes students.

Arlis Tomislav Duntak is now fighting on front lines. According to the latest word, he is still alive. Some of his classmates have not been so lucky, Capk-Habekovic said.

"We are losing a whole generation of men and women," she said. "You can't believe the savagery. It will take generations to heal the wounds."

The idea to host some type of fund-raiser was born in the alumni group, of which Capk-Habekovic, a lecturer in the Romance Languages Department at the University of Michigan, is a member.

A chain of contacts led Capk-Habekovic to the right place in Zagreb. A Croatian economist, Jacqueline Panic, put her in touch with sculptor Feruško Bogdanic and others who led her to the art works she brought back to the states.

"They have students who have lost everything in life," said Capk-Habekovic, who spoke with professors at the fine arts academy, which is the oldest in Europe.

First she had to get permission from the academy to get the artworks, which were donated for the fund-raiser with a promise that proceeds would be returned to the academy. Capk-Habekovic has spent the last few weeks getting the etchings and linocuts framed, the cost of which was borne by the alumni association.

Those who keep up in the art world may recognize a couple of the artists. Among the works to be displayed are some by Miroslav Sutej and Frane Fano, both internationally well-known.

Though the works are not necessarily political, many are symbolic of the strife now occurring in the former Yugoslavia. Some also have a religious bent, such as one depicting a crucified hand.

"This is the first exhibit where the artists are presented," said Capk-Habekovic, who remains stunned at what she saw during her spring visit to her homeland.

She had returned home two years ago when fighting began. She was shocked then and remains so. Her first inclination that her homeland had changed came quickly when she landed at the airport in Zagreb.

"This is generally a busy airport. We were the only plane that flew in. There was not that traveling commotion there usually is at the airport. You had that oppressive feeling that something is not quite right."

While visiting, Capk-Habekovic

didn't restrict herself to her mission. She visited refugee camps.

"They (refugees) said they were just happy to escape with their lives," said Capk-Habekovic, who came to the states in 1974.

Capk-Habekovic also traveled to Dubrovnik on the coast where much of the fighting has occurred. She doesn't hesitate to show the before and after in photos of buildings in the historic and cultural center.

Despite her U.S. citizenship, Capk-Habekovic retains her ties to her homeland. "I have no family here," she said. "I was basically a follower. I followed my husband here. He was in medical school and came here to specialize."
