It's a trade he learned from his father who learned it from an uncle. His father, Catino Vizzini, opened the Farmington shop in 1959 and retired a couple of years later, teoring it to his son Mitcheel.

Since then, Mr. Vizzini has been commuting from Allen Pork. He was known for irregular business hours. When it was time for lunch or a break, he simply closed up shop, leaving a note on the door.

Quito often Mr. Vizzini could befound at the Old Village Inn, a reaturant and bar a few doors down Grand River, on those breaks.

"He'd sit and have a chat," said John Cowley, Old Village Owner, "We're going to miss him. He was a good friend. If I needed to go to the bank, I'd say, 'Hey Mike, watch the bank for a minute.' And he would."


Mr. Vizzini was adamant about one thing. His children would not follow him into the business.

"It's a craft, and today crafts don't pay off," he said in a 1979 Farmington Observer story. "In the crafts, there is no way you can have volume and quality at the same time. And today, the world is all quantity."

His son Michael, for example, visited the shop many Saturdays, but knew he'd never inherit the business. Instead, he became an engineer, as did his bruther, Anthony.
