Beginning at approximately 9 p.m. EDT Sunday, Sept. 6, and continuing for 21's hours, the live broadcast will feature its traditional blend of

will feature its traditional blend of stellar entertalamment and informa-tion about neuronuscular discases and MDA's battle to defeat them. Starring show business legend and renowned humanilarian Jerry Lew-is, the Telethon's entertainment lineup will offer some of the bright-est sars of inim, stage, nightclubs, television, music and sports, as well as some surprises. The show ill orig-inate from the Sahara Hotel in Las Vecas. with satellite feeds from Vegas, with satellite feeds from other locations across the country. The Telethon will also feature profiles of adults and children who are served by the Muscular Dystro-phy Association's programs, and will update viewers on scientific ad-vances achieved by MDA's world-wide research program during the last toor

wide research program during the last year. More than 80 million viewers an-nually watch the Telethon, which is carried by more than 200 "Love Network" stations across the United States and Canada. In addition to en-joying great entertainment, viewers phone in pledges of support for MDA's programs of research and services to benefit more than a mil-lion Americans with 40 neuromusclion Americans with 40 neuromusc-ular diseases. Last year's Telethon garnered a record \$45.1 million in

pledges and contributions. Lewis is considered the most ef-fective fund-raiser in history for his more than four decades of volunteer

World-renowned as an actor, co-median, director, writer, producer and headline entertainer on stage, screen and television, Lewis has starred in nearly 30 films, including "The Nuity Professor," "The Bell Boy," "The Errand Boy" and "The King of Comedy." He wrote and di-rected many of his comedies. His television acting credits include the dramatic series, "Wiseguy," and the movie, "Fight for Life." Box office gross receipts of Lex-is' films total about \$500 million, making him one of the most success-ful performers in show business his-tory. The only entertainer ever to be nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize, Lewis has also received the Jefferson Award from the American Institute for Public Service; the Le-gion of Honor and Commander in the Order of Arts and Letters, France's two highest awards, the U.S. Department of Defense Medal for Distinguished Public Service; and numerous other humanitarian and numerous other humanitarian awards

awards. The first MDA Labor Day Telethon was broadcast by one TV station in New York in 1966. Lewis was Joined by stars including the Muppets, Joe Namath and Sammy Davis Jr., who would become a Telethon stalwart. Ed McMahon, still Jerry's Telethon co-host, made his first appearance in 1968.

his first appearance in 1968. The Telethon was alred coast to coast for the first time in 1970. Noted performers in the next dec-ade ranged from John Lennon to Mickey Mouse. In 1976, Frank Sina-tra suprised Jerry by bringing Dean Martin on stage for a touching live reunion of the former partners.

live reunion of the former partners. Show business's biggest names continued to grace the Telethon in the 1980s. In 1986, comedian Billy Crystal's moving monologue about a friend who used a wheelchair brought in the greatest telephone re-sponse in the show's history. Ringo Starr brought his All-Star Band, featuring classic rock stars, to the Telethon in 1989.

Letta Gibbons became a co-host in 1990 for the 25th anniversary show, which Jerry dedicated to the memory of Davis.
