NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE C-35-92, an ordinance to amend Arti-cle IV. Offenses Against Property, of Chapter 18 Offenses, of the City Code of the City of Farmington Illils, to add a new section to define and regulate the ordine of retail or fraud committed in a store open to the public.

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS ORDAINS

Section 1,
Division 3, Theft and Related Offenses, of Article IV, Offenses Against Property, of Chapter 18, Offenses, of the City Code of the City of Farmington Hills is hereby amended to add a new section, Section 18-140, to read as follows:

18-140. Retall Fraud.

Retail Frast.

Any person who does any of the following in a store or in its immediate vicinity is guilty of retail fraud:

(a While a store is spen to the public, alters, transfers, removes and replaces, conceals or otherwise misrepresents the price at which property is olfered for sale with the intent not to pay for the property or to pay less than the price at which a product is offered for sale.

(b) While a store is open to the public, steals property of the store that is offered for sale.

(c) With intent to defraud, obtains or attempts to obtain money or property from the store as a refund or exchange for property that was not paid for and belongs to the store.
