### PBS offers 'Higher Goals' for student athletes

For young athletes who would rather be told to hit the showers than hit the books, there's PBS' upcoming special *Higher Goals*, which attempts to put a new spin on that attitude. The program, airing Sunday, Oct. 11, follows two high-school athletes as they dream of playing pro basketball and struggle to graduate and get into college. By showing kids the value of an education, it encourages them to apply the principles of practice and self-discipline to academics as well as sports.

Featured guest Isiah Thomas of the Detroit Pistons offers a reality check for those betting everything on a career in sports: "The chance of you making it to the pros is like walking in the jungle and not being bitten by a mosquito."

British actress Helena Bonham Carter, known for her roles in costume dramas including *Lady Jane*, *A Room With a View* and *Howard's End*, will make her American television debut this season as Marina Oswald, widow of accused presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald. The NBC TV movie, dubbed *Marina's Story*, is being filmed on locations in Texas and Russia. Asked to compare her latest role to the others, Carter quipped, "It'll be good not to be in a corset for once."
