FORFEITURE BEGUN

Girl, 16, charged with traffic death

A 16-year-old North Farmington High School girl surrendered herself to Farmington Hills police Thursday in connection with the traffic death of a 41-year-old Waterford Township man in a Jeep/motorcycle accident at 13 Mile and Stratmore on Aug. 25.

The student is charged with negligent homicide, a high misdemeanor that carries a maximum penalty of two years in prison or \$1,000 fine. Because of her age, however, the student is being charged as a juvenile, said Sgt. Ray Cranston of the Farmington Hills Police Department's traffic section.

On the charge will be scheduled later in Oakland County Probate Court.

After the student was fingerprinted and photographed she was released to the custody of her attorney, Cranston said.

The juvenile petition is similar to an arrest warrant and arraignment. A preliminary examination

driven by a 16-year-old girl attempted to make a left turn into the Stratmore subdivision. As children at a nearby bus stop watched, Greeson was dragged under the Jeep.
