## Legislators tied up on assisted suicide

Assisted suicide will continue to be legal in Michigan as state lawmakers gridlocked again on a life and death issue.

IIIe-and-death issue. A House subcommittee on death and dying this week took no action on the Senate-passed bill to make assisted suicide a four-year felony. That bill was de-signed to "put Kevorkian's lights out," in the words of its sponsor, Sen. Fred Dillingham, R-Fowler-ville.

Plan B is, if we can't substitute, there will be a move for dis-charge" — that is, to force Dill-ingham's bill out of the House Judiciary Committee. "We've never had the votes in the House (Judiciary) committee. Sut we ve done several question-naires. We have more than ample votes to win on the House floor." Dillingham said. The House has adjourned until Nov. 5, two days after the elec-hous the Pawer-Wallace bills eady for full House action in that seasion.

Michael Alan Schwartz,

Southfield attorney representing Kevorkian, last week denounced Dillingham's bill as "draconian, extremist," sought by "a small number of people who raise a bojsterous noise," an apparent reforence to Right to Life. "Study? Who's to study it?" Schwartz said of Power's bill. "Only one person has the techni-cal skill in this field — Dr. Kevor-kian." Schwartz blamed the 'prosecu-tiona of Kevorkian and effort to John Engler and Oakland County Prosecutor Richard Thompson, "I'm a registered Republican, and skill ay that," Schwartz zeid.
