Birmingham.


LILA C. HARTFORD

The leaf pickup program for Farmington residents begins Oct. 26 this year. This map shows the area schedules and dates of pickup. Residents are requested to rake leaves onto the right-of-way area between the sidewalk and the curb; on uncurbed streets leaves should be raked to the edge of the street. Leaves must be bagged for regular pickup on weeks not scheduled. All vehicles must be parked on private property during leaf pickup hours of 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. This schedule is subject to change due to weather or other factors.

year when 5,000 gallons were collected.

At the May disposal day, only 350 gallons of latex paint were dropped off. But that was after the cities sent out flyers informing residents they can dispose of the non-toxic paint on their own.

"We had no flyers this time about the paint," Bissell said.

"We may want to put something out before-hand next time."

At the next disposal day planned for sometime in May, 1993, residents also may receive a flyer with information when they bring in latex paint. "We hate to turn someone away who takes the time to bring it. We'll just tell them the right way to do it."


