

2 from Troop 179 elevated to rank of Eagle Scout

Boy Scout Troop 179, sponsored by the First Presbyterian Church of Farmington Hills, awarded two of its members the rank of Eagle Scout.

Nicholas Hailey of Franklin and Douglas Voigt of Farmington Hills received scouting's highest rank at an Eagle Scout Court of Honor held Sept. 22.

Hailey is a freshman at Kenyon College in Ohio where he plans to study for the next four years, then continue in a graduate program.

He graduated in May from Detroit Country Day School. His activities have included the election of class officer, staff writer for the school paper, member of the Environment Club, karate, school plays, Catholic Youth Organization and alter server.

In addition, Hailey has played soccer and earned the defensive MVP Leadership Award and the

Most Improved Player Award for his team, which became the state champ all three years he played. Hailey is still playing soccer for Kenyon.

In scouting Hailey has served as an assistant senior patrol leader, patrol leader and quartermaster. Hailey's Eagle Scout service project was conducted at his church, St. Owens in Franklin, where he built a library.

His many responsibilities included building wooden shelves and painting them, painting the walls of the library, and furnishing the room. He is the son of Jay and Barbara Hailey of Franklin.

Voigt is a recent graduate of the University of Detroit Jesuit Academy where he obtained a 3.5 cumulative grade point average and received the Presidential Academic Fitness Award.

Voigt is currently a freshman at Harrison High School. His many activities have included CYO Basketball and NFWB Baseball.

He has also studied the Korean Martial Art of Choi Kwang Do, where he is a registered Black Belt with the rank of 3rd Dan.

While in Cub Scouts, Voigt earned the Arrow of Light Award. Since joining Troop 179, he has earned the World Conservation Award, the Troop's Distinguished Guide Award, as well as the Ad Altari Dei Award presented to scouts by the Roman Catholic Church.

Voigt has served the troop as an Assistant Patrol Leader, Patrol Leader, Instructor, Webelos den chief, and troop scribe. He has also completed one year terms as troop guide and troop quartermaster.

He is a Brotherhood Member of the Order of the Arrow and is currently chairman of the Chapter's

Ceremonies Committee.

For Voigt's Eagle Scout Service Project, he planned, developed and provided leadership for the parish of St. Fabian Catholic Church where he and his parents are members.

This involved the design, construction, installation and landscaping of 10 wooden benches around the playground and the athletic field which required over four hundred hours to complete. He is the son of David and Ella Voigt.

TIN, R9E, Northeast 1/4 of Section 7, City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, located on the south side of Thirteen Mile Road, west of Halsted Road. Containing 2.065 Acres.

All ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect twenty-one days after their enactment.
