About 78 percent of expenses for the district go to salaries, wages and benefits. Top expense categories included "instruction" which accounts for 49 percent and "support services" which ac-counts for 40 percent.
A total of 96 percent of reve-nue is local in nature with most coming from local property taxes.
A total of \$1.4 million in school property taxes were ap-peeled according to information from the district liability column. For the 1991-92 school year, the

district levied a total of 33.37 mills including 31.5 mills for the general fund, 6 of a mill in the debt fund and 1.25 mills in a cap-ital projects fund, The total state equalized value for property in the district totaled \$2.51 billion compared with \$2.37 billion the previous year.
