A. As a pet owner myself, I fully understand how important your cat is to you and your husband. In 1987 a federal law was passed concerning pet ownership in apartments that are subsidized with federal funds.

After checking with the apartments you are planning to move to and with MSHDA, I discovered that the federal law does not apply to your new residence. There is a clause in the lease you will sign that specifically says that no pits are allowed. This is perfectly legal.
