

UF Gives St. Mary \$1.5 Million

St. Mary Hospital, now in the midst of a building program, has been given a capital fund grant of \$1.5 million by the United Foundation of the grant was made by Jacob Sobieraj, president of the board of trustees of St. Mary. He said the money was awarded for the completion of the second and third floor shell areas.

The grant is considered an acknowledgment by the United Foundation of the needs of the people in the communities served by the hospital - Livonia, Plymouth, Northville, Farmington, and Redford Township.

"IT IS WITH deep appreciation," Sobieraj stated, "that the Felician Sisters and the board of trustees of the hospital accept the grant for the promotion of health care in the Northwest Wayne County Hospital region."

The work for which the grant was provided already has been outlined in detail and now is in the process of being constructed.

The second floor shell provides for an enlarged and remodeled operating suite which will include, among other facilities, four additional operating rooms, a new recovery room, anesthesia

office and work rooms, doctors' dictation areas, east rooms, instrument storage and work rooms.

The third floor shell will include five additional nurseries, a special procedure room (for circumcisions, etc.), three new delivery rooms and six new labor rooms.

THE PRESENT building project was begun in 1969 and it will be several years before it is completed.

The first phase of the huge plan, now nearing completion, has provided for new boiler, electrical and mechanical

equipment facilities for both the existing hospital and the addition now under construction.

Among other things provided are enlarged laundry maintenance and engineering quarters in the basement and a dietary department on the first floor, aside from the new and beautifully designed cafeteria for employees and visitors on the first floor.

The addition, now in the early stages of construction, will provide a modern full basement and a five-story winged facility.

Planned as phase two, it will connect with the existing

hospital and a new lobby will be constructed at the connecting area. This also will be the new main entrance and will face Five Mile Road.

TARGET DATE for the completion of phase two is 1972.

Following that, a complete remodeling of the original hospital-phase three-and the completion of the existing shells will get under way.

Opened in 1959 with 180 beds, St. Mary will boast nearly 600 beds when completed and will be largest health facility in the northwest area.
