

4-Play Season Set By U-M Players

ANN ARBOR — Tickets are now on sale for the University of Michigan's summer repertory season, which gets under way July 13 with a production of Shakespeare's "Twelfth Night." All performances will be in the Middelton Theatre.

Season subscriptions are on sale at prices ranging from \$5 to \$8.50 by writing to the University Players, Department of Speech, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, 48104. "Twelfth Night" and "You Never Can Tell" by George Bernard Shaw will run alternate nights July 13 through 17 and July 20 through 24.

Tennessee Williams' play, "A Streetcar Named Desire," will be staged July 27 to 31, and the season will close the week of Aug. 3 to 7 with "Five on the Black Hand Side" by Charles Russell. "You Never Can Tell" is often called one of Shaw's gayest and most frivolous plays. At the same time, it treats of a theme of special relevance, the conflicts and contempts of a complex family situation.

The Charles Russell play is a moving and comic account of a crisis in a black family as the daughter's wedding day approaches. Guest director Philip Dean will stage it.

Members of the company are all advanced students at the end of their training. The box office will open June 21. It will be open until July 9 from 12:30 to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. From July 12 to Aug. 7, it will be open from 12:30 to 8 p.m. on performance dates. Single tickets will go on sale July 1.

Dog Obedience Classes Set

Daytime and evening classes in dog obedience are being offered this summer by the Oakland County Parks and Recreation Commission. Classes will be held in the Waterford-Oaks Activities Center, 2800 Watkins Lake Rd., Waterford Township.

Auditions Are Planned For Children's Theatre

Anyone over 12 who has an interest in the theatre is invited to attend auditions for the Hans Christian Andersen Play Productions. Acting, singing, dancing, music and stagecraft experience would be helpful, but are not necessary.

The auditions will be held Thursday, June 17, from 7 to 10 p.m., in Garfield Elementary School, 10218 Arthur (one block south of Plymouth Rd. and two blocks west of Wayne Rd.), Livonia.

HCAPP is a new children's theatre group being organized in Observance by Robert Rogez. Rogez lives in Livonia and teaches in Pierce Junior High School in Redford Township.

A graduate of Wayne State University in music composition, he has been using some of his spare time to compose musicals based on fairytales.

His first composition in this field was Hans Christian Andersen's "The Magic Tinderebox," and the group was formed to produce it. Rogez's original intention was to set more Andersen stories to music and produce them, but he had difficulty finding another suitable one. "A lot of them were too gory for children."

So the next play planned is a

music version of a French fairytale, "East of the Sun and West of the Moon." The story is similar to the more familiar "Beauty and the Beast."

Twelve actors and actresses are needed, along with backstage help, and even ushers.

A FALL PRODUCTION date is slated, but there is a possibility the group will present a summer play. Three more plays are projected for the 1971-72 season.

"The Magic Tinderebox" had 12 performances in Livonia this year under the sponsorship of the Association for Childhood Education of Livonia. From the proceeds, the association was able to donate \$200 to the YMCA to send children to summer camp.

"East of the Sun" will also be sponsored by the association. Rogez formerly taught chorus in Taylor, and while he was at WSU, he helped write several student musicals. He has also taken part in Livonia Redford Theatre Guild, Will-O-Way and Detroit Resident Artists Theatre productions.

Working with him are Jon Tanner, as director; Mrs. Diane Magaw, a Dearborn kindergarten teacher, who has had experience in musicals; Enio Marcaccio, set designer; Victor Berman, lighting

technician; Anne Varley, president of the Stevenson High School Drama Guild; Russ Vogel, president of the Franklin High School Drama Guild; Reggie Zacharias, a master's degree candidate in voice at WSU; and Roger's daughter, Stephanie, who attends Stevenson.

Pow Wow Is Set For June

An all-Indian pow wow will be held at History Town, 6080 W. Grand River, four miles west of Brighton off Interstate 96, on Saturday and Sunday, June 26 and 27.

All proceeds will go to the North American Indian Scholarship Fund. The pow wow will open each day at 2 p.m., with dance contests for men, women and children. There will also be a contest Saturday evening at 8. Prizes will be awarded and all contestants must attend all three performances.

Indian craft will be sold and the public is invited. Admission will be \$2 for adults; \$1 for students; and 50 cents for children under 12. The pow wow is being sponsored by the North American Indian Association.
