# OCC's Potters Market this weekend

The Potters Association of Oakland Community College's Royal Oak Campus will hold its 17th Annual Potters Market, Friday, Dec. 4-6. The event, which has a large following throughout the metropolitan area, will again be held at the United Food and Commercial Workers Hall in Madison Heights. Admission is free.

The Potters Market, an integral part of the college's ceramic technology program, teaches students how to design and make items, and how to market them. "What began as an exercise in the business aspects of being a potter has grown into the largest sale of its kind in the country," says Charles Blosser who founded the program. "Ap-

proximately 8,000 people attended last year's sale, and nearly 18,000 functional and decorative items were sold during the three-day event.

Students involved in the Potters Market are responsible for all facets of planning, organization, staffing, publicity, inventory, stocking, setup, sales and record keeping. Advertising

starts in late summer when they begin passing out fliers at art fairs in the area.

One hundred and twenty advanced students and former students participate in the show. They decide on their product line, design their ware, and determine the number of pieces they want to produce. The students then schedule their work

so that the desired production can be completed in time for the sale. Many start their production as early as July.

OCC's ceramic technology program was designed and developed by Blosser in 1974. The purpose of the program is vocational, and many area potters have received their training in the large ceramics shop on the Royal Oak Campus. Approximately 260 students are currently enrolled in ceramic technology classes, making it one of the largest programs in the country.
