Berryman said DiNello's report "neither acknowledges nor reports the hours of testimony from phy-sicians, nurse, psychologists, so-cial workers, clergy, academi-clans, parents, teachers, curricu-lum directors, superintendents, state and local school board numbes who praised the Michi-gon Model."

Far from hatching the model in secrecy. Berryman said, the state board and a steering committee held repeated public meetings un-der the Open Meedings Act. DiNello first says the Michigan Model re-sulted in "Increased adolescent sexual promisculty" and then said it "has never received appro-riate evaluation to determine its

officacy in the classroom." Moreover, Berryman said, "The Michigan Model does teach that abstinance is the best way to avoid pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases.
