



The three wisemen brought gifts of gold, frankincense and myrnt to the Christ Child as he lay in the manger that first Christmas 2,000 years ago. During the 19th Century, American families adopted the legend of St. Nicholas, introduced by Dutch settlers as Sinter Klaas.

Jewish parents gave Hanukkah gelt — coins — to each child on one or all nights of Hanukkah in Eastern Europe during the 18th Century. American Jewish families expanded the custom after World War II, giving gifts to members of their extended families and friends as well.

Today, believers of both faiths continue the custom. This special section is dedicated to the gift-giving tradition.
